As CASA Chairperson and Co-Organising Chairperson of the 16th ASEAN Congress of Anaesthesiologists, I would like to welcome you to Kota Kinabalu, Sabah. I am very happy that Dr Angela Enright, President of WFSA, has joined us here at the 16th ACA to show her support for CASA and our activities.

There are many activities that CASA had planned but unfortunately due to financial and time constraints, we have not been able to carry them out. There is much potential for more to be done as CASA, and I hope that we will be able to achieve this in the near future, and that CASA will help anaesthesiologists in the ASEAN region to "Forge Ahead Together".







ABOUT CASA

CASA was formed in the late 1970s with the following aims and objectives:

- To promote closer ties amongst the national societies of anaesthesiologists in particular and the world in general by personal contact and all other means available.
- 2. To organise regular meetings so that anaesthesiologists in ASEAN can exchange views, information, knowledge and experiences in medicine and in anaesthesiology and critical care.
- 3. To help elevate the standard of training and practice in Aanesthesiologiy and Critical Care in ASEAN.

Originally, CASA had only 5 members - Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand, Philippines and Indonesia. In 2001 at the 22nd CASA Executive Committee meeting in Cebu, Philippines, a resolution was passed to include Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia and Myanmar as members of the Confederation, bringing the membership of CASA up to a total of 9 countries.

CASA delegates one of its member societies to organize the biennial ASEAN Congress of Anaesthesiologists (ACA). The ACA is a unique event which combines scientific program with cultural exchanges between the anaesthesiologists from ASEAN. Through CASA, many anaesthesiologists in ASEAN are now good friends, and we always look forward to the ACA where we will almost certainly renew our acquaintances, as well as make new friends. Of the new CASA members, only Vietnam has organized the ACA (in 2005). We look forward to the future when the other new members (Laos, Cambodia and Myanmar) can organize one of these congresses.

CASA Presidents' Forum

3rd July 2009 (Friday) (1130 - 1330 hrs)

The Presidents' Forum is an event not to be missed. This will be in the form of a discussion panel, with Presidents of the Societies of Anaesthesiology of Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam as panelists, making short presentations and answering questions posed by a

This year we have chosen a few current topics to discuss, to help us discover what the situation is like in different ASEAN countries, and how we can learn from each other. There are topics of mutual

interest and we would like to see how CASA members can strengthen the position of anaesthesiologists and improve the standard of anaesthesiology in our respective countries.

One topic will be discussed at a time, each for about 20-30 minutes. One or two of the Presidents will make a short presentation on the topic, and the other Presidents as well as members of the floor will then respond. We would like to invite everyone to come so that we can have a lively discussion on topics which are very pertinent to anaesthesiologists in the region.

The following topics will be discussed:

1. Specialist Register

Some of the ASEAN countries have specialist registers, while others do not. Questions on the necessity for a specialist register, what the requirements are and whether it should be a legal requirement or voluntary will be dealt with.

Intensive Care

Issues addressed will include who runs (or should run) intensive care units, and whether intensive care be managed as an "open" or "closed" system? (A "closed" system means that one specialist (e.g. intensivist) is in charge of all patients in the ICU and acts as the coordinator of care for each patient who may also be under the care of any number of specialities. An "open" system is where each patient is looked after by different specialists, depending on the problem, or the primary unit under which the patient is admitted; the ICU provides a higher level of monitoring and nurse-patient ratio.) We will also be looking at the question of whether intensive care should be a separate specialty (from anaesthesiology).

Non-Physician Anaesthetists

Some countries have non-physician anaesthetists (e.g. nurse anaesthetists), while others do not. In some countries, this is seen as the solution to the shortage of anaesthesiologists in the country. We would like to discuss the pros and cons of having non-physician anaesthetists, whether they will really address the manpower issues. If non physician anaesthetists are in existence, or are to be trained, what should be the level of training for such a group of professionals, and what is their role vis-à-vis the specialist physician anesthesiologist?



This workshop will give an opportunity for the clinicians to increase their skills in the management of medical emergencies using medical simulators. The program comprises mini-lectures and hands-on-workshops using state of the art simulators and audio visual equipment, aimed at improving individual knowledge, teamwork dynamics and effective communication which may be crucial in obtaining a favourable outcome during the stressful conditions expected when confronted with medical emergencies. The sessions will be conducted by a team of experts in their respective fields and who have had extensive experience running the simulation programme.
